PWU Special Academic Program

A. Salient Features

- Teacher-enrollees will hold classes in their work-places.
- A class consists of twenty (20) students for masteral and fifteen (15) for doctoral.
- Teaching/learning delivery is done on a mix mode basis face-to-face contact of Professor with students and online.
- Trimestral basis.
- Classes can be clustered to maintain the ideal size of twenty (20) should there be a reduction in the number of enrollees for the succeeding trimester.
- Tuition fees are comparatively low and may be paid in full or installment.
- Program can be finished in one and a half (1 ½) years.

B. Benefits to the enrollees

- Provide access/opportunities for busy teachers to advance their career in the teaching profession.
- Provide opportunity for horizontal and vertical promotions of teachers.
- Upgrade the technical and professional competence of teachers by learning and developing new attitudes, skills and knowledge.
- Freedom from stress triggered by the worsening traffic condition.
- Professors will be tapped from the Division of City Schools to ensure "handson and practical approach to the learning environment".
- Create "peer pressure" to develop the much-needed motivation for the student-enrollees to get their diploma within the time-frame prescribed to finish the program.

C. Benefits to the Division Office/Educational System

- Empower teachers of the division and the entire public school system.
- Improve teaching and learning delivery in the division.
- Improve quality of education in the division and the entire public educational system of the country.
- A good legacy of the Superintendent to the teachers of his/her Division.

D. Duties of the Division

- Provide the venue where classes can be held.
- Encourage teachers to enroll in the program.
- Ensure timely payment of tuition fees.
- Issue study permits to teacher-enrollees.
- Recommend qualified professors from the division who can teach in the special academic program.
- Consult with the representative of the Philippine Women's University to ensure continuity and success of the Special Academic Program

E. Duties of the Philippine Women's University

- Provide the academic program and the support system such as the ff:
 - o curriculum for the master/doctoral degrees
 - o syllabus

- o enrollment forms
- o tuition fee structure/schedule of payment
- o library card
- Provide training for faculty members on the use of the online mode of the program.
- Collect the tuition fees in coordination with the representative of the division.
- Provide orientation program and/or seminar at the end of every trimester.
- Coordinate the program with the division to ensure its continuity and success.
- Issue transcript of record, special order and diploma to graduates of the program.

F. Memorandum of Agreement

 A memorandum of agreement will be drafted and signed by the representative of the Philippine Women's University and the Division Office identifying all the duties/obligations of the parties involved in the Special Academic Program.
