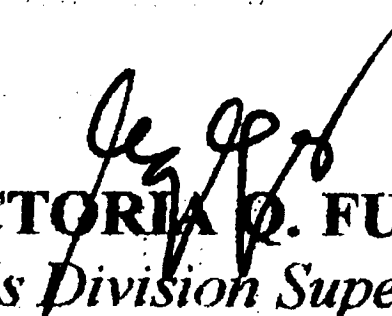

1. The Children's Museum and Library, Inc. (CMLI) in coordination with the Department of Education (DepEd) will hold the 39th Annual National Grade School Convention on August 27 - 31, 2009 and the 51st Annual Convention of CMLI Junior Members and Teacher Advisers on October 26 - 30, 2009 at Teachers' Camp, Baguio City with the theme: "Ang Teacher Advise sa Pamilya sa Salita at sa Gawa".

2. At the end of the convention, the participants should be able to:
