

We are pleased to inform you that the School Feeding Program Roundtable Discussion was successfully conducted last July 24, 2012 at the DepED Bulwagan ng Karunungan. Various private organizations, NGOs, and GOs participated in the activity to sustain the partnership between the public and private sectors in improving the health and nutritional status for the attainment of education outcomes. In the message of Secretary Br. Armin A. Luistro, FSC he expressed his desire to attend to the 512,187 severely - wasted children in the country and challenged the group to help DepED overcome the situation of undernutrition. As an output of the activity, the group recommended the identification of schools where these severely wasted children are located, and from these schools, identify which are not covered by any feeding program so that interested companies/foundations may fill-in the gap.

In line with this, may we request the division office to submit the breakdown of severely wasted elementary students by school and by grade level based on the SY 2011-2012 Nutritional Status Baseline Report you submitted last year. We have attached the NS Report you submitted and we expect that the total number of severely wasted students submitted to us last year will be exact/the same data with the data by school which we are now requesting. If there will be discrepancies with the data, please cite the reason for such discrepancies.
