



"Emir", a full feature, musical film set in a fictional emirate in the Middle East, tells the story of how Amelia (Nanny or Yaya) from Ilocos decided to work abroad to help her family.


"Macario Sakay" is a film about the untold shining point of the nation's history during the revolutionary government of the Philippines and the American war.

The viewing of these films will help develop the value of nationalism, idealism, and patriotism among students and teachers.

Sakay (Julio Diaz) became the new leader of the Katipuneros and continued to lead Insurgent activities against the Americans until his eventual surrender and executionIn 1907.The biopic also tackles the momentous events surrounding Philippine Struggle against American colonialism.



Her journey reveals, through words and music, the life that overseas Filipino workers live - their struggles to have a better life... their dreams, and hope that someday their hard work will finally be rewarded.



IKAW ANG PAG-IBIG, The movie is a tribute to the Tri-centennial celebration of the Philippine's devotion to Our Lady of Peñafrancia of Bicol Region in the Philippines. It's joint production of UNITEL, MDAFI (Marilou Diaz-Abaya Film Institute), and the Archdiocese of Caceres, and it will be distributed by Star Cinema.

The religious film, Ikaw Ang Pag-ibig depicts the true story of love and defines love like no other. The film that took about 2 and a half years in



the making is helmed by the award-winning filmmaker and breast cancer survivor herself, Marilou Diaz-Abaya. KAMOTENG KAHOY, is a film that follows a town's journey from painful trauma toward healing through the intercutting points of view of the two child survivors and the old woman vendor. The story, which revolves around the life of **Thelma** (Salvador) who resolved into using her skills in running after a family mishap took place is quite ordinary Filipino story. Such story has long been portrayed in telenovelas or in several films in the Philippines. The only unique about it is, it focuses on "running" which for some reason has become a popular sports in the country today.



DED NA SI LOLO, the Philippine's Official Entry to the Foreign Language Film of the 2010 OSCAR Awards. A family oriented film forced by circumstances to reunite and bear each other's companies while the wake of their dead father is held. Love and Family ties come together in this delightful comedy drama filled with laughter and tears. The story unfolds with the ever observant eye of Bobet, a grandson of the deceased, who, in the process also learns the various complexities of what death could bring the living members of the family. The drama that ensues in dealing with the loss is usually the springboard of comic instances and happenings in the event. And so with the revelations of long kept secrets, pent up emotions and other bones of the skeleton in the closet.



MGA MUNTING TINIG The Melinda (Alessandra de Rossi) is a new substitute teacher at the Malawig Elementary School, located in a poor remote barrio. A young university graduate, her family expects her to look for work abroad, but in her idealism she takes on a challenging job in the provincial public school, which lacks resources and has corrupt personnel.



DAYO is the first Filipino full-length animated movie featuring a combination of 2D and 3D technologies. It follows an 11-year old kid named Bubuy as he tries to save his beloved grandparents who have been abducted into Elementalia, a mysterious, mystical, and magical land abounding with strange flora and fauna and a host of popular creatures from Philippine mythology. Brimming with local color, character, and charm, and boasting spectacular vistas of never-beforeseen fantastical lands, DAYO stands a shining example of Filipino filmmaking artistry and craftsmanship. More importantly it offers viewers – local and foreign alike – a warm, hearty peek into the Filipino mind, heart and soul.



INANG YAYA, is an <u>Independent film</u> which features the love of a mother and a nanny. This movie by <u>Unitel Pictures</u> stars <u>Maricel Soriano</u> and child actresses <u>Tala Santos</u> and <u>Erika Oreta</u>.

Ang oras nahahati. Ang puso hindi.



URDUJA is set in the 13th century, the film is a fictionalized tale of Princess Urduja, legendary warrior princess of Pangasinan. As the only daughter of Lakanpati, chieftain of the Tawilisi tribe of Central Luzon, Urduja grew up as a warrior with the ability and willingness to defend her people from their rival tribe, the Badjaos.

Sakay - is a historical film released in 1993. It is a dramatization of the life of Macario Sakay, a Filipino revolutionary general who fought against the Americans during the Philippine-American War, which ended on 23 March 1901 with the capture of General Emilio Aguinaldo. The film depicts the stronghold of Sakay and the members of his anti-colonial organization, the Tagalog Republic (in Filipino: Republika ng Katagalugan). Upon the capture of Aguinaldo, Sakay continues the fight for independence from the American government. Ultimately, he and his men are overwhelmed by the American forces.

Plot - The film covers the life of Filipino patriot and hero <u>Macario Sakay</u>, who was declared an outlaw and a criminal for continuing hostilities against the <u>United States</u> after the "official" end of the <u>Philippine Insurrection</u>.

Sakay is a tailor from <u>Tondo, Manila</u> who joins <u>Andres Bonifacio</u>'s revolutionary secret society <u>Katipunan</u>. He fights during the <u>Philippine Revolution</u> against <u>Spain</u> and later in the <u>Philippine-American War</u>. Sakay remains in the field even after the capture of <u>President Emilio Aguinaldo</u> and the fall of the <u>First Philippine Republic</u>. He is captured, but is released during an amnesty.

Sakay then takes to the mountains to revive the <u>Katipunan</u>, together with <u>Francisco</u> <u>Carreon</u>, Julian Montalan, Cornelio Felizardo and other rebel leaders. He proclaims himself as General and President of the "<u>Tagalog Republic</u>" (*Republika ng Katagalugan*), and engages the <u>United States Army</u> and the <u>Philippine Constabulary</u> in guerrilla warfare. On occasion he is aided by <u>talisman</u>-wearing cultist warriors.

After years of fighting, Sakay is convinced to surrender by Filipino labor leader Dr. Dominador Gomez, who argues that the establishment of a <u>Philippine National Assembly</u>, instead of armed resistance, is the soundest option towards attaining Filipino independence.


On the understanding that the government had offered amnesty, Sakay and his officers come down from the mountains. However, Invited to a reception in town, they are arrested by the government. They are tried and convicted for brigandage. Sakay and Colonel Lucio de Vega are hanged, while Montalan and others receive life imprisonment.
