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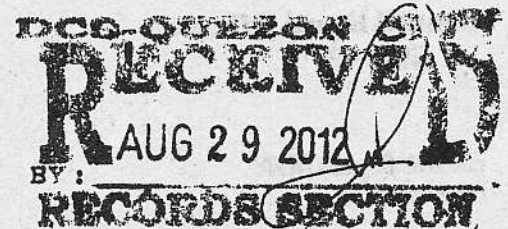

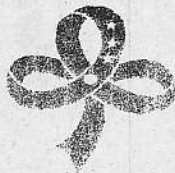

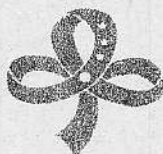

GIRL SCOUT WEEK CELEBRATION

September 16 – 22, 2012

Theme: 'Stop the Violence. Speak Out for Girls' Rights'

Day 1	September 16	FAMILY DAY
		Sub-Theme: <i>A Harmonious Family Life for a Peaceful Community</i>
		<i>Suggested Activities:</i>
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> One-day Family Gathering/Outdoor Activity with other Family/ies Troop wide campaign for a "Same Time, Meal time" (Dinner with the whole family at 7pm on this day) then share the story in a funny and creative way in the troop meeting. (Who was late? Where did you eat? What did you talk about? Is this a good tradition to be revived every Sunday? etc.) Family Clinic: Parents-Children relationships, etc.
Day 2	September 17	GIRLS' DAY
		Sub-Theme: <i>Stop the Violence – Start with Myself</i>
		<i>Suggested Activities:</i>
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Design or Jazz up an old T-shirt using the girls' creativity. Use one to three words that will describe their stand against Violence that should be shown or interpreted in the design. Use cloth patches, buttons, recyclable materials, etc. Then wear the shirts all together in a particular date and time. ➤ (Ex. "Be Aware!", "Speak Up!") Hold a buddy-buddy discussion or small group discussion about how one's own attitude and behavior might contribute to the problem. Make a report on the assessment and submit to the troop leader. Listen to other girls and women about their views on Stop the Violence and learn from them and their experiences. Share the information in an expressive way like Public Speaking, Performing Arts, Prayer/Song/Poem/Essay Composition, and Visual Arts during a troop meeting or gathering.
Day 3	September 18	COMMUNITY DAY
		Sub-Theme: <i>Be the Change You Want to See</i>
		<i>Suggested Activities:</i>
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Fun Walk for A Cause – invite young girls and young women (non-GS) in the community to join in a parade showing placards of "What You Want to See in your Community and What You Can Do" ex. Change the Old Ways, Change for the Better, Help!" Organize a Community Service Project for the benefit of abused children like Supplementary Feeding, Share-A-Meal, Kids fest, etc.

Day 4	September 19	SELF-IMAGE DAY
		Sub-Theme: <i>My Ways Mirror My Self Esteem</i>
		<i>Suggested Activities:</i>
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Emphasize the uniqueness of every girl's looks, size and style and send a powerful message that girls should value their characteristics making it the source of their high self esteem: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Have an "I love Myself because..." session or day ➤ Share with a fellow girl scout or group into those with the same answer and have fun comparing of "fun-arguing" during a troop meeting. Start a journal about what she wants about herself. Also, put in the journal what she doesn't want about herself and what she can do to counter that negative thoughts. Make sure the number of negatives should be lower than the positive. This way, the girl will exhaust her "positive" points and will psychologically affect her. <p>After a certain period, revisit the journal. Knowing that these are essential parts of who they are, note the improvements and developments and share with the troop leader.</p>
Day 5	September 20	ESCODA DAY
		Sub-Theme: <i>Remembering Our Great Founder</i>
		<i>Suggested Activities:</i>
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Josefa Llanes Escoda Ceremony Quiz show about the life of Josefa Llanes Escoda and GSP historical milestones Sharing of research work (done a week before) via "I Am Like Escoda" and share what trait/s of Escoda one possesses – Share with the troop via written and oral presentation Social Networking: Promote an information campaign about Escoda like facebook picture sharing or information sharing; or other creative ways to re-introduce Escoda and share to Girl Scouts and non-Girl Scouts alike.
Day 6	September 21	TROOP LEADER'S DAY
		Sub-Theme: <i>My Troop Leader, My True Leader</i>
		<i>Suggested Activities:</i>
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Troop Leaders' Gathering: Floral/Bouquet Corsage Offering Text brigade congratulating the Troop Leaders for their efforts Virtual cards with messages for Troop Leaders why she's a True Leader Creative handmade cards made by the troops for their troop leaders stating why she's a true leader Recognition ceremony for active Troop Leaders Testimonies, etc.

Day 7	September 22	ALLIANCE DAY
		Sub-Theme: <i>Partners for Prevention of Violence</i>
		<i>Suggested Activities:</i>
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Be creative in doing a research about other organizations (e.g. DSWD, Council for the Welfare of Children, etc.) that share the same cause as "Stop the Violence." Share the knowledge gathered akin to that "Fortune Cookie" concept, written in rolled paper. Give to at least 10 Girl Scout and non-Girl Scout who come in first in the classroom or arrive first in troop meeting. Or, give to some friends from the partner organizations. Invite a resource person from other partner organizations who can talk about Stop the Violence campaign on causes and consequences of violence against women and girls and how it can be prevented.
